It is believed that Rain Sticks were used by indigenous

farming tribes in arid (dry) climates with the hopes of calling for rain for their crops. They were often made from dried cacti, bamboo or hollow reeds then filled with pebbles or beans, and beautifully painted with patterns.

Have a look in your recycling for all of the components (parts) you will need for your home made Rain Stick




Be a Space Dust Hunter
