Papercraft Origami Dog


Origami is the Japanese word for paper folding. ORI means to fold and KAMI means paper. Together, they form the word, "origami."

You will need to take your time with this as the folding takes a little bit of time to get used to. Practice makes progress and there's spare paper too!

You will need:

- 1 sheet of square origami paper
- Pencil

<u>Step 1:</u> Fold the square of paper in half diagonally. Unfold and then fold in half diagonally in the other direction and unfold. Fold all the points inwards to meet in the centre to make a smaller square.




<u>Step 3:</u> Open out the opposite point and then fold it back on itself so the point extends beyond the square by 1.5cm. Fold in half as shown.

Step 4: Open out the front flap so the point is extended, then fold diagonally as shown in the middle picture. Then fold the point down along the crease line.

Step 5: Repeat Step 4 on the other side. Turn the fold on the front of the dog's head inside out to create a snout. Draw on eyes and nose











Pipe Cleaner Dragon

You will need:

4 pipe cleaners

Craft foam

• 1 Craft stick

Googly eyes

Scissors

Step 1: Cut a small section from the end of a craft stick and round off.




<u>Step 2:</u> Fold the pipe cleaner in a circle to make the head. And leave some for the neck.



<u>Step 4:</u> Tuck a 3rd pipe cleaner under the others and keep wrapping. Leave the end hanging to be the tail.







Step 3: Take a second pipe cleaner and wrap it tightly around the neck starting just under the head, then wrap around the body.



Step 5: Add craft foam horns and tail and glue on googly eyes. Cut four pieces for the legs and glue them on. Cut and add foam wings.

Craft a Mechanical Hand

You will need:

- Paper or Card
- Straws
- Glue or Tape
- Wool/Cord
- Scissors

<u>Step 1:</u> Draw around your hand onto a piece of paper or card.



<u>Step 2:</u> Cut this hand shape out. Cut it a little bigger than the actual outline.

<u>Step 3:</u> Mark your finger/thumb joints on the cut out. Note that you have three joints on each finger/thumb.

<u>Step 4:</u> Next, draw lines straight across the joint or curve them slightly.

Step 5: Folder the fingers/thumb at all the lines.

<u>Step 6:</u> Cut the straws slightly shorter than each of your finger joints.



Step 7: Tape or glue the straws to the hand.

<u>Step 8:</u> Thread some wool through each finger. Each finger will have its own piece of wool.


Each of these threads will move a different finger or the thumb.

<u>Step 9:</u> Finally, thread all the strings through one straw that you have taped to the wrist part of your paper/cardboard hand.







Dolly Peg Craft

In Victorian times clothes pegs were made from wood. The dolly peg was carved out of a single piece of wood with a split up the middle at one end and a ball at the other end.

We would like you to create your own dolly peg craft.

You will need:

- A dolly peg
- Glue
- Have a look around your house and see what you could use to help you with your creation. Make sure you ask first . Think about what you have left over in your craft box.

Here are some ideas if you're stuck:

Cardboard,
Scraps of fabric,
Wool,
Tinfoil, Feathers,
Paint, Felt,
Buttons,





Papercraft Lantern

You will need:


- 2 sheets of colored paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Glue, tape or a stapler if you have one.



<u>Step 1:</u> Begin by cutting two strips down the long side of one of the sheets of paper and put them to one side.

<u>Step 2:</u> Next fold the second sheet of paper in half to form a long skinny rectangle.

<u>Step 3:</u> Draw pencil lines on this skinny rectangle as shown here. Make sure the lines are the same distance apart. Do not draw your line right to the top of the folded paper.



This is the folded edge

Step 4: Cut along the lines with scissors. Remember don't cut all the way to the top.

<u>Step 5:</u> Open up the paper and roll so that the two long edges meet. Your lantern will start to look like the picture above.

Step 6: Glue, staple or stick the edges together.

<u>Step 7:</u> Roll the first sheet of paper up and insert it inside your lantern and secure it in pace. Using the strips that you cut off, you can create a handle and decorate it as shown in the picture.



Using the Plasticine in your box we would like you to make a model of your favorite animal or perhaps you might take up the Let's Craft Alien Invasion Challenge to make a friend from outer space.

We've kept our idea suggestion simple for this one but would love to see your finished masterpiece!



The great thing is that once you have finished one creation, you can squish it all back together again and start on something new.
